

Rolling Waves



Please read all instructions before starting. All fabric measurements have ¼ inch seam allowance included. Unfinished block measures 12½"x12½". When pressing seams, press towards darker fabric unless otherwise stated. Arrows show direction of pressing seams. Place right sides together when piecing. Remember to square off the final block so that it is an even square and to get rid of jagged edges.

When choosing fabric, this pattern is perfect for using up from the scrap stash.

Requirements:

- Quilters cutting mat, rotary cutter, and ruler.
- Sewing thread (I use natural coloured 100% cotton)
- Scraps from the fabric stash,

The instructions to complete 1 block are as follows:

Colour 1 (dark blue)

 $A = (8x) 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " $x 4 \frac{1}{2}$ "



Colour 2 (light blue)

 $B = (1x) 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " $x 4 \frac{1}{2}$ "



Colour 3 (white or other solid colour)

C = (8x) 4 ½" x 4 ½ "

Let's begin....

Draw diagonal lines on wrong side of all fabric square A, C .




Stitch fabric A square to fabric C square. Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ "away from seam. Press.





Make 8

Assemble and stitch fabric panels together as shown to complete the block.




CONGRATULATIONS!

To complete the quilt, follow the diagram.
